Phil works for Hampshire County Council as a Computing Inspector/Advisor, he is a CAS Master teacher and teaches for two and a half days a week. He shares his learning journey on his website code-it.co.uk. He is a contributing editor to "Compute-IT", a key stage three scheme of work published by Hodder and has recently written "How to Teach Primary Programming using Scratch" produced by University of Buckingham Press. He was involved in the drafting stages with writing the new Computing National Curriculum. Above all he is passionate about the necessity for struggle and failure within computing and the importance for our pupils of embracing these across the curriculum.
